

# School Plan 2018-2019 - Wasatch High

## Goal #1 Goal

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The percentage of Wasatch students who are college career, and community ready as measured by SAGE will increase in proficiency to 60% (matching best proficiencies against 20 most similar high schools in Utah) in English, math, and science.

## Academic Areas

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- Reading
- Mathematics
- Writing
- Science

## Measurements

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SAGE proficiency will be measured against 2018 SAGE results which are not yet available.

## Action Plan Steps

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Align English 9 and 10, math 1 and 2, earth science, biology, physics w/tech, and chemistry courses with SAGE standards.

Align science and social studies with Reading and Writing Standards for Literacy.

Counselors and teachers will develop weekly advisory classes which will be used to teach study skills and other academic behaviors.

Provide content support classes for struggling students.

Provide graduation coaches for struggling students.

Tutorial classes will be taught four times a week to address specific standards that have not been learned.

Enrichment tutorial classes will be taught four times a week to students who have already mastered essential standards.

Provide professional and development and out-of contract time to teachers to align standards, essential learning, and assessments.

Provide professional development opportunities for teachers to improve tier 1, tier 2, and tier 3 instruction.

## Goal #2 Goal

The percentage of Wasatch High School sophomores who are college, career, and community ready (minimum reading lexile of 1200) identified by the Spring 2019 NWEA, will increase to 80% matching the number of seniors who self report pursuing post-secondary education at graduation.

- Writing

## Measurements

NWEA testing will be used to measure reading lexile twice a year. Interim reading tests administered according to program recommendations will be given more frequently to those students receiving additional reading support classes.

## Action Plan Steps

Reading and Writing standards from Utah Core will be used in science and social studies courses.

English with reading support classes taught for students who are more than two grade levels behind.

Blocked English with reading support classes taught for student who are more than four grade levels behind.

Teachers across the curriculum will receive professional development in literacy and improved practice in tier 1, tier 2 and tier 3 instruction.

Graduation coaches will be used to support students who need additional help outside of their regular schedules.

After hours tutoring will be provided for students who need additional support.

Counselors and teachers will construct advisory classes that will enforce behaviors that lead to academic success.

Tutorial classes will be offered four times a week for those students who need additional support in literacy.

Provide monthly school-wide reading activities through our Wasatch Reads program including ways to celebrate those who have been making significant gains in literacy.

Provide a school-wide summer reading program.

Purchase additional books for our school library.

\$1,500 - General Supplies (610)

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Twenty-five percent of Wasatch juniors will reach all four ACT college benchmarks by the spring of 2019.

## Action Plan Steps

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Align junior English, math, and chemistry courses with ACT standards.

Align science and social studies courses with ACT reading.

Align science and social studies courses with ACT writing.

Provide ACT preparation courses.

Provide support classes for struggling students.

Counselors and teachers will construct weekly advisory courses teaching behaviors that lead to academic success.

Weekly tutorial sessions will be provided to students who need additional support.

Professional development opportunities will be given to teachers for tier 1, tier 2, and tier 3 instruction.

Out of contract time will be available for teachers to align curriculum with standards.

Tutoring will be provided for students who need additional support.

Teachers will attend professional development to improve instruction.
