Stay Home When Sick

Parents monitor student health daily; if a student is sick, they should stay home

Employees are screened daily with temperature and screening questions

Visitors are screened upon entrance with temperature and screening questions



Cleaning

Increased routine for day and night custodial cleaning, including high touch areas, playgrounds, school equipment and buses

No sharing of classroom supplies and equipment



Hygiene

Wash or Sanitize Hands:

Stations available as students enter/exit building, classroom, cafeteria, bus

Reinforce Physical Distancing:

Encourage no handshakes, hugs, high-fives

Water Stations:

Student/employees bring their own water bottle; filling stations made available



Positive Cases & Symptoms

If symptoms arise at school, student will be sent to designated wait zone until parent arrives

Students and faculty who test positive will quarantine until 72 hours symptom-free and cleared by a health professional

Classmates of students who test positive will be informed by school



Face Coverings

A face covering will be **provided** to every employee and student

Employees will be required to wear a face covering whenever teaching, in hallways, during transitions, etc.

Students must wear face coverings in the classroom, common spaces, on buses and during transitions

Visitors will be required to wear face coverings
